

MODULE A: OSHA 1926.1153 RESPIRABLE SILICA FIELD GUIDE

1. Respirable Crystalline Silica (RCS) Health Hazards

Cutting, grinding, or drilling concrete, masonry, brick, or asphalt generates microscopic respirable crystalline silica particles (< 2.5 microns). When inhaled, these fine particles penetrate deep into the alveolar sacs of the lungs, causing permanent scarring (Silicosis), Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), and lung cancer. OSHA 29 CFR 1926.1153 mandates strict engineering controls to maintain exposure below the Permissible Exposure Limit (PEL) of 50 ug/m3 (8-hr TWA).

2. OSHA Table 1 Specified Exposure Control Matrix

Handheld Saws (Cut-off / Masonry Saws)	Continuous water delivery to blade. Integrated water feed system fed by pressurized tank or tap water line.	No Respirator (APF 0)	APF 10 (N95 / Half-Mask)
Walk-Behind Saws (Floor & Street Cutters)	Continuous water feed to blade during outdoor operation. Indoor cutting requires local exhaust ventilation (LEV) or water + APF 10.	No Respirator (APF 0)	APF 10 Respirator
Stationary Masonry Saws (Block / Tile Saws)	Enclosed blade guard with continuous water pump & bath delivery system to prevent dust release.	No Respirator (APF 0)	No Respirator (APF 0)

DRY CUTTING LEV & HEPA AIRFLOW CAPTURE FORMULA

When dry cutting with local exhaust ventilation (LEV), vacuums must feature HEPA filtration (99.97% efficiency down to 0.3 microns) and an automatic reverse-pulse filter cleaner. Calculate minimum required airflow using the industry formula:

REQUIRED VACUUM AIRFLOW (CFM) = BLADE DIAMETER (INCHES) x 25 [Example: 14" Blade x 25 = 350 CFM Required]

3. Respiratory Protection & Prohibited Housekeeping Practices

Respirator Seal & Fit Test Rules (29 CFR 1910.134):

- Mandatory initial medical evaluation prior to mask assignment.
- Annual qualitative/quantitative fit testing for each operator.
- STRICT CLEAN-SHAVEN RULE: Facial hair must not cross the sealing surface of tight-fitting facepiece respirators.

- NO DRY SWEEPING or dry brushing of silica dust debris.
- NO COMPRESSED AIR cleaning of clothing or equipment.
- NO ALLOWING SLURRY TO DRY: Wet slurry must be vacuumed or collected immediately before water evaporates into airborne silica dust.

PROHIBITED HOUSEKEEPING PRACTICES:

MODULE B & C: MECHANICAL BLADE SAFETY, KICKBACK & SITE HAZARDS

Centrifugal Safety, RPM Limits & Blade Solder Integrity:

1. MAX OPERATING RPM: Operating diamond blades above the marked Max RPM risks catastrophic segment fragmentation.

2. WET vs. DRY BLADES: Running "Wet-Only" blades dry overheats silver-brazed segment bonds, causing segment fly-off hazards.

3. FLANGE & ARBOR FIT: Inspect flanges for cupping or debris. Ensure arbor pins lock cleanly without force or oversized bushings.

Kickback Prevention & Substrate Hazard Controls:

- PINCH KICKBACK: Maintain straight cuts. Never twist or force blades. Stand clear of blade trajectory plane.

- UTILITY MARK-OUT: Perform mandatory 811 utility calls before trenching. Verify absence of post-tension cables and structural rebar.

- TOXIC COATINGS: Inspect old concrete for lead paint or asbestos coatings before dry cutting.

MODULE E: DIAMOND BLADE SELECTION & BOND MATRIX

Substrate Hardness	Bond Matrix Type	Segment Feature	Recommended Operating Mode
Asphalt & Green Concrete (Soft, Highly Abrasive)	Hard Bond Matrix	Drop-Segment Core Protection	Wet Cutting Recommended to prevent undercut core failure.
Cured Concrete & Brick (Medium Hardness)	Medium Bond Matrix	Keyhole / Segmented Slots	Wet or Dry Cutting with HEPA LEV Vacuum Shroud.
Hard Granite & High-PSI Rebar (Extremely Hard)	Soft Bond Matrix	Tall Turbo Segments	Wet Cutting Mandatory (Exposes fresh diamond grit).
Tuckpointing Mortar (Abrasive Joint Removal)	Hard Bond Matrix	Wide 0.250" Sandwich Segments	Dry LEV Shroud (Minimum 175 CFM Vacuum Airflow).
Refractory Brick & Porcelain (Brittle / Glassy)	Ultra-Soft Bond	Continuous Rim (No Slots)	Continuous Water Bath (Zero chipping, smooth finish).

MODULE D: PRE-SHIFT 5-MINUTE TOOLBOX TALK SCRIPT

TOPIC: SILICA DUST CONTROLS & DIAMOND BLADE SAFETY

SUPERVISOR SCRIPT:

1. "Before starting any concrete or masonry cutting today, inspect your diamond blade for core cracks, segment loss, or arbor damage."
2. "Verify that water lines are hooked up and flowing continuously to the blade, or ensure your HEPA vacuum is connected with minimum 25 CFM per inch of blade diameter."
3. "Dry sweeping slurry or dry dust is strictly prohibited. Wet slurry must be vacuumed immediately before drying."
4. "Respirators (N95 / Half-Mask APF 10) are required for indoor cutting or shifts exceeding 4 hours. You must be clean-shaven where the mask meets your skin."
5. "Stand clear of the cut line to prevent injury in case of blade pinch or kickback."
